


Leatherworking

- Leatherworking classes have been held over the last couple of years and have been very well received.
- Leatherworking dovetails nicely with other Makersmiths shops and tools.
 - Cosplay: costuming and props
 - Metal Shop/Blacksmithing: scabbards and sheaths
 - Laser: cutting and engraving
 - Arts and Crafts
 - Industrial sewing machine
- Makersmiths has limited tools on hand for leatherworking
 - Instructors have brought in their own tools for members to use in class

The Ask

- Project Budget of \$2500 to purchase leatherworking tools and supplies for upcoming classes with funds sourced from the Operations Budget. After 3 months any unspent funds will be returned to the Operations budget
- Appointment of Diane Bollinger as Leatherworking steward
- Establishing a monthly budget of \$200 to replenish class supplies



The Ask

Space impacts

Tools and supplies will be stored in a rolling cart. If overflow space is needed, there
is a drawer already allocated for leatherworking in one of the Husky tool chests in
the Cosplay Room.

Classes

- Current plan is for 1-2 advanced leatherworking classes per month
 - Some classes likely to be multiple days
 - Some larger projects (Armor) may be broken up into multiple classes (wrist guards, chest piece, shoulder guards, etc.)
 - Classes can be held in the Leesburg Classroom or Main Room, or in the Green Room at Purcellville if use of the industrial sewing machine is needed

Tool Use

 Tools will be available for general use. They will <u>not</u> be considered Red Tools and will not require additional training prior to use.



Motions
